### **Definitions**

Therapeutic Riding – Open to riders of all ages with a disability. May use spotters, leaders, etc.

Pee-Wee – 10 & under.

Youth – Under 18.

Novice – Open to riders that have never won three blue ribbons in any discipline.

Young Horse – Horses 5 years old and under.

Gaited Classes – Western or English tack.

Speed – Horse and rider required to enter and exit at a walk.

Open – Classes that are open to riders of any age and horses of any breed.

Jackpot – 1<sup>st</sup> place-25%; 2<sup>nd</sup> place-15%; 3<sup>rd</sup> place-10% of entries.

Western Classes – No Gaited horses.

### **CHS Rules & Regulations**

1. Rules and Regulations by AHSA and AQHA.
2. Negative Coggins required and must be presented at the entry booth when you register for classes and pick up your number.
3. CHS will assign a number for each horse/rider combination for the year.
4. In case of a tie for Champion or Reserve champion: One point will be awarded for each class entered in the division. If a tie still remains, the winner will be determined by a coin flip.
5. For Year-End ties, an additional point will be added for each show attended.
6. **You must show in at least four shows to be eligible for year-end awards.**
7. Jackpot classes must have 5 entries to payback.
8. Riders in Lead Line **MAY NOT** go into other riding classes. Riders must be 10 or under.
9. Other than the Lead line or Therapeutic classes, participants may not be led in classes.
10. Patterns for Youth and Adult Horsemanship and Equitation will be at the judge's discretion. No patterns for Novice Rider.
11. The judges' decision is final.
12. Breaks will be announced throughout the day as needed with a 30 minute lunch break at the discretion of the judge and/or show manager.
13. All dogs must be kept on a leash.
14. **DRESS CODE:** Appropriate clothing based on class is required. **NO TANK TOPS OR SPAGHETTI STRAP TOPS.**
15. Protective headgear may be worn in any class with no penalty. Hunters must wear protective headgear when mounted.
16. No Horse Washing!
17. **APPROPRIATE AND HUMANE TREATMENT OF HORSES IS EXPECTED AND REQUIRED. VIOLATORS WILL BE EXPELLED FROM SHOW GROUNDS.**
18. **ONLY SOUND HORSES WILL BE JUDGED.**
19. **NO ALCOHOL ON PREMISES!!!**
